Measurable Outcomes for Each Collaborative Team

1. Definition, scope, success criteria, and timeline for deliverables (1 year)
2. Inventory and analysis of existing resources (e.g., literature review, subject matter experts, publications, programs, etc.)
3. Identification and access to resources and constituent targets
4. Educational web-based audio conferences (target = 2)
5. Conference presentations (e.g., AONE, AWHONN, AACN, NONPF, ARN, NADONA, etc.)
6. Comprehensive white paper-type document (modeled after TIGER Summary Report)
7. Articles for publication and dissemination amongst broader TIGER audience
8. Chapter in the 4th Edition of the Nursing Informatics Series *Where Caring and Technology Meet*

Timeline of our TIGER Collaborative Team Activities (1 year)

- **Phase I** – Information Gathering (September – November)
 - Information gathering of examples, case studies, literature review, etc. – The intent is to collect a wide range of models and information—not to analyze.
- **Phase II** – Analysis of Data/Identification of Gaps (Dec – February)
 - Complete analysis of findings
 - Create summary of findings, gap analysis, and develop initial recommendations
- **Phase III** – Develop a preliminary set of recommendations that includes a dissemination strategy (March – June)
- **Phase IV** – Final Report/Toolkit Preparation (July – September)

Usability & Clinical Application Design – Goals/Objectives

- Design requirements and/or goals
 - Support evidence-based practice
 - Enables collaborative and interdisciplinary care
 - Provide seamless access to published literature, knowledge
 - Support the creation of new knowledge (knowledge discovery requirements)
 - Speed the translation of research into practice
 - Supports the continuum of care
- Usability requirements and/or goals
 - Informed by and/or positively transforms nursing workflows
 - Identify key criteria for workflow to integrate with other disciplines
 - Systems designed using principles of human factors
 - Work with system developers to maximize clinical system effectiveness and efficiency for nurses
